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The Report

A further seminar on a case of good practice and strengthening relations between project partners was held at the RIS Dvorec Rakičan in Rakičan on Thursday, 21 October 2021, and on Friday, 22 October 2021.

The project partners arrived at the RIS Dvorec Rakičan around 10 o'clock. This was followed by registration of participants and socializing. At 10.30 the seminar started with an opening speech from the director of the RIS Dvorec Rakičan, dr. Robert Celec. He welcomed the guests and pointed out the good mutual cooperation as part of the joint project. Such cooperation enables project partners to exchange good practices and share opportunities for progress in various fields.

First, the RISKO Youth Center was presented, which is an organizational unit of the RIS Dvorec Rakičan public institution, the founder of which is the Municipality of Murska Sobota and the co-founder of the Association for Technical Culture of Slovenia. The purpose of the RISKO youth center is to improve the level of key competencies and skills of young people, including young people with fewer opportunities, and to encourage their active participation in society. Thus, they pay special attention to intercultural dialogue, social inclusion and solidarity of young people. It offers young people a place where, outside the formal education system, they can discover their abilities, increase their skills and acquire new knowledge accompanied by youth workers.

This was followed by a short coffee break, where participants exchanged their views and discussed the topics presented. This was followed by a presentation of international conferences

by Monika Dajčar, Head of International Conferences. RIS Dvorec Rakičan traditionally organizes three international professional and scientific conferences annually, namely "Ecology for a better tomorrow", "Food, exercise and health" and "Challenges and problems of modern society". The last conference, which is IX. International conference Challenges and problems of modern society, was presented in more detail. It took place from 23 June 2021 to 30 June 2021 in RIS Dvorec Rakičan. This conference was addressed by various experts, including experts in the field of pedagogical practice, whose common theme is environmental education and modern ecological challenges in the process of education. One of the important goals is to contribute to modern methods and forms of work that will be a good basis and motivation for environmentally aware knowledge. Participants in international conferences presented their contributions with a fairly wide range of topics, including examples of good practice, especially in the fields of education. As part of the contributions, it was also possible to perceive the sharing of experiences in working with vulnerable groups, which gives us an insight into effective solutions for the best possible coexistence of diverse groups.

After lunch, the ZZ Roma program was presented. It is co-financed by the Ministry of Labor, Family, Social Affairs and Equal Opportunities of the Republic of Slovenia. Tadeja Šlatau, head of the Roma ZZ program, presented the program, which is set on the basis of the Roma Community Development Strategy in Pomurje region. In the program, through individual work

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with the user and through workshops, they raise awareness of the importance of health care and

a healthy lifestyle for both the individual and the whole family in order to empower them with the awareness that they can influence the situation. The ZZ Roma program also represents a support system for creating new green jobs through a demonstration plantation of miscanthus. The program tries to strengthen users in the field of knowledge, which is one of the fundamental areas for social inclusion.

Another example of good practice is the Pomurje Family Center, which is a central place for families in Pomurje region. Tadeja Horvat, head of social programs from RIS Dvorec Rakičan, presented how they provide a space for informal socializing and implement quality content in order to meet the needs of children, adolescents and various forms of families in all stages of life. The activities they carry out are various educational and practical workshops, themed days for families, holiday camps, groups for parents, individual counseling and group workshops to help and support the family as a whole. This concluded the first day of the seminar.

On the second day, participants focused on the dissemination and possibilities of using the examples of good practice presented the day before. Thus, they presented their views and asked

additional questions that arose about the programs implemented by the RIS Dvorec Rakičan. A real debate has developed as to what are the examples of good practice, how they can use them

in their work and what are the possibilities for improvement. With the implementation of similar programs and good mutual cooperation, all project partners can further develop their competencies and improve any shortcomings. Lunch was followed by a meeting on the current state of the project. Jovanka Ulić presented at what point the project is, what has already happened. Further activities that will follow were presented and agreements on the implementation of these activities were concluded.
